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Extraneous Material

The maximum deduction per question/sub-question for extraneous material is 1 point.

To indicate such a penalty, cross one of the ticks awarded and put an e beside it: χ_e

Examples (Question 2b - 2 points available)

- 1. No smoking or drinking. Be punctual.
- 2. Arrive one hour early. Don't drink or smoke.
- 3. No drinking allowed. Don't smoke after work and arrive early.
- 4. No alcohol or smoking. Be punctual.
